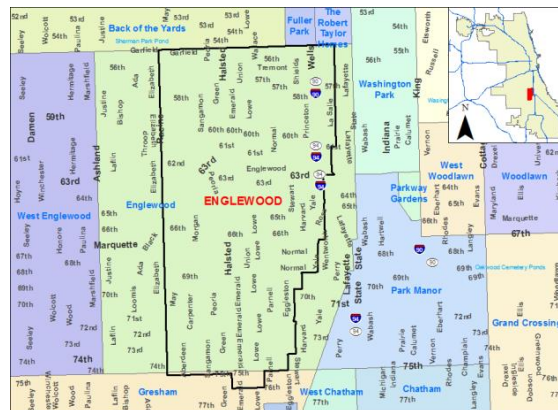

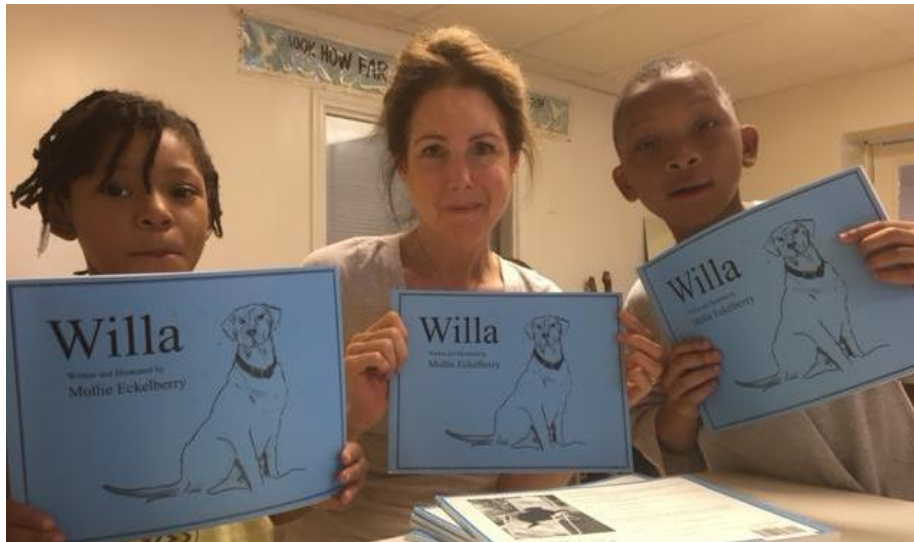

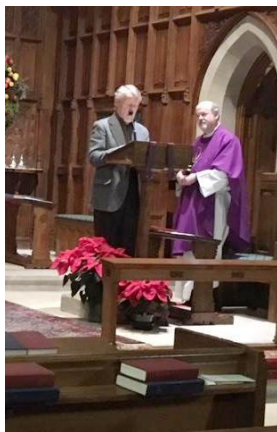
Thistle & Spoon Outreach Ministry invites you to a panel discussion

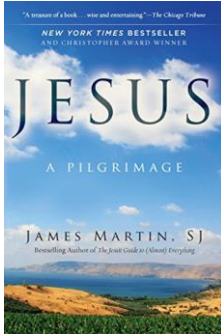

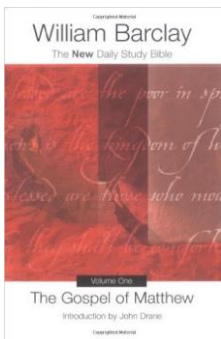

The thistle often represents the crown of Jesus, and is an important part of the historical architectural detail in the church. The spoon is a symbol of the commitment to continuing God's work and feeding the hungry.

It was a festive, merry, loving Christmas at the North Shore Sheltering Program. The children put Christmas lights and presents of wrapped hand and toe warmers as well as "Snowman Soup," and all the ingredients of hot chocolate, on the tables. They handed out beautiful menus to each guest. 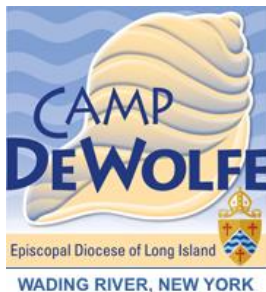
