





CURATE'S LETTER

Dear St. John's of Lattingtown,

race and peace to you all in the name of our Lord, Jesus Christ. As we come together for our 2023 Annual Meeting, I would like to express my gratitude for the opportunity to serve as Curate here at Saint John's for a third year! I am continually encouraged and inspired by each and every member of our St. John's community.

We were overjoyed to offer the ALPHA Course to our community last Spring. Alpha is a series of conversations focused on the questions of life, faith, and meaning. Each session includes a time to connect with others, enjoy a meal together, then hear a talk on some element of faith, and then offers a chance for people to share their own questions and perspectives with the group. We are offering this course again this Spring with classes running from May 3rd – June 21st



from 6:00-8:00 pm. It is not too late to join us! To register, call 516-671-3226 or email catherine@stjlat.org.

This past year, we also began an adult Bible study at the Curate's Cottage that was attended regularly by approximately ten people each week. The study was developed in connection with the book *Walk in Love: Episcopal Beliefs & Practices* by Scott Gunn and Melody Wilson Shobe. The purpose of this program was to help St. John's members go deeper in our understanding of our Christian faith, learn about foundations of our life as Episcopalians, and join together for some much-needed fellowship, coffee and treats each week. We plan to resume our Bible study again this coming Fall.

In addition, we have continued to provide seasonal adult formation offerings. This year, our journey through the Lenten Season followed the theme of "The Work of Lent." This course made use of our new set of the Stations of the Cross that was created during last year's Lenten Art Project. We followed a contemporary version of the Stations liturgy, and enjoyed a meal and discussion around the many tasks of Lent, including prayer, fasting, almsgiving, and sacrifice. Following our study session, participants enjoyed a beautiful, candle-lit Compline service with Ruaraidh Sullivan and the Choral Scholars.

Our children and youth also continue to be an important and vibrant part of the life of St. John's. We are so proud of the ways these young people have worked to make the love of Christ known in our communities. Each member of our 2023 Confirmation Class completed a variety of community service projects with NOSH, the local Men's Shelter, and DUO (our "Do Unto Others" Youth Group), to name a few. We also provided training and coaching for our many acolytes throughout the year, and even led our first "Acolyte Retreat" this past winter!

It truly is an exciting season at St. John's of Lattingtown! There are so many ways to get involved and our incredible staff is always ready to help you get connected! May we all give thanks to God for the many blessings of this wonderful faith community, and may we continue to go forth, rejoicing in the power of the Spirit! Alleluia! Alleluia!







The most devoted parishioners and the best Outreach team anywhere have made our outreach programs a significant agent of transformation in our community.

Our love for our Savior gave us the strength, stamina, courage, compassion to serve during the pandemic. Not only did we serve well, we have grown our programs far beyond what we thought possible.

NOSH Emergency meals (Allison Aston, Sarah Blundin, Claudine Baldwin) in its first three years has delivered nearly 1/2 million meals to under resourced families with St. John's parishioners serving on the board, packing NOSH bags, delivering meals and running food raisers!

Painting 4 Penny (Julie Zarou, Gina Tomenson, Sarah Cooney, Bliss Smith, Asia Baker Stokes) mission is to paint the world the color of Penny Doerge's love and we have done that sending our children's paintings to patients at Glen Cove Hospital and HSS as well PAAS egg coloring kits to 670 under under resourced families from Roslyn to Glen Cove to Bayville to Hempstead.

Our Full Circle Ministry (Maria Corigliano and Fiona Elliot) connecting children and seniors in our community) Children's Apple Ministry (Ashley Nesi) teaching the fundamentals of outreach to our youngest parishioners, St. John's Of Lattingtown Holiday Meal Boxes (Lindsay Fox and Nitika Moran) delivering festive boxes filled with groceries for a holiday dinner to over 100 local families, and our beloved Thistle & Spoon Ministry (Diana Fredericks) has been comforting and nourishing the homeless and hungry for a decade. Our Community Lights Ministry (Shannon Vulin) hosts our annual Old Fashioned Christmas Party and annual Backpack Giveaway for over 160 families partnering with Grenville Baker and Glen Cove Boys & Girls Club as well as Bayville Library and our local school systems.

Our new "Bundles" model for outreach events has made a huge impact on the way we serve, grow and bond as a parish with so many new members and families moving out of Manhattan. By holding creativity and compassion based events with up to 3 or 4 ministries at the same time — we have brought considerably more people through the doors of St. John's. The impact of these events has also blessed thousands and thousands of people in our greater community from hospital patients to seniors to families struggling with inflation and housing.

WARDEN'S REPORT

It will be said on that day, Lo, this is our God; we have waited for him, so that he might save us. This is the Lord for whom we have waited; let us be glad and rejoice in his salvation.

[Isaiah 25:6-9]

Easter greetings, and Alleluia! The Lord is risen!

It is with a fulfilled sense of being, belonging and purpose – full hearts – that we report that the power and the glory of the Holy Spirit is abundant at St. John's of Lattingtown. The concept of light in scripture is detailed, and St. John's continues to serve as a beacon of the light of Jesus Christ, shining His light brightly and directly into the hearts of so many, into the darkest corners and to the farthest reaches of our community all from our little corner of Old Tappan and Lattingtown Roads.

There has perhaps never been such a vibrant and energized period in the history of our parish as we are witnessing presently. St. John's of Lattingtown continues, day-in and day-out, to spread the word of our risen Lord in so many ways. In just four hours on Sunday, there are five different opportunities to engage with Christ's ministry: an 8:00 Holy Eucharist Rite I, 9:00 St. John's For Kids service, 9:30 Faith Matters Adult Bible Study, and 10:30 Holy Eucharist Rite II with Sunday School. Programming continues throughout the week, with almost daily offerings that include: Our Nurture Prayer Group on Monday mornings, Tuesday afternoon is Religious Education For Kids with Alcoholics Anonymous later in the evening, Wednesday's are Healing Eucharist & Bible Study in the chapel (and zoom), Fridays are Father Mark's "Fitzhugh Fridays" on Instagram and Facebook, and Saturday finds another AA meeting in the Parish Hall. Alpha will be offered again this spring.

Under the leadership of Father Mark and Mother Catherine, members of St. John's participate in no less than a dozen community outreach ministries. NOSH recently served its 500,000 meal! Thistle and Spoon, North Shore Sheltering Program, Full Circle Ministry and DUO all serve those in need throughout our community. This, in addition to Thanksgiving, Christmas and Easter boxes.

The extraordinary beauty of our grounds is a daily blessing. Last night for the first time we hosted our annual Spring Gala on our lawn. In September we celebrate the 70th anniversary of our Country Fair.

With gratitude to God we welcomed Ruaraidh Sutherland as Director of Music Ministry. A lay choir has been formed and the coral scholars program continues to grow.

As your Wardens, we would be remiss if we did not celebrate and give thanks for the ministries and leadership of Father Mark and Mother Catherine and their families. Mary Savin and Mary Syracuse continue to bless us with their devotion and hard work. The blessings of our ubiquitous Courtney Callahan impact every aspect of life at St. John's, especially our children. Our Sexton Mat Stimola is a true gift and we continue to be

thankful for the ministries of our Vestry Clerk Nancy Sanborn and Treasurer George Stimola. Finally, we give thanks for the General Manager of the Barn, Kate Scefonas and the Barn Cats.

It is our honor to serve as your Wardens. We extend heartfelt thanks and best wishes to our retiring Vestry members: Virginia Apple, Carolyne Dilgard-Clark and Tom Gimbel and retiring Warden Ian Gumprecht. May God continue to bless and shine his light upon St. John's of Lattingtown.

OUR MUSIC

The Choral Scholars continue to be the core of our musical ministry, rehearsing weekly, singing at the 10:30 am Eucharist, and acting as Cantors throughout the year. In January, we said goodbye to long-serving Choral Scholar Meghan Tanella, but in March we welcomed Evan Licari and Hans Kiessling to the program. This May, Kyla Surajbali and Amanda Larsen will be graduating from the program and we look forward to celebrating them as they move to greater things. The Choral Scholars offered a concert on the afternoon of Palm Sunday.

In December, a 'scratch-choir' of adults drawn from the parish sang for the Christmas Pageant, and since March the renewed adult Parish Choir has been singing regularly for Sunday morning services. Four professional section leaders have been appointed – Kyla Surajbali (who will begin in September following graduation from the Choral Scholarship program), Kate Reese-Lerner, Richard Scillia, and Peter Saunders. Our choir will lead us in Choral Evensong on May 14th at 4:00 pm in the church.

During Lent, we began "Coffee, Cake, and Hymns", singing and learning traditional hymns at coffee hour. This program will continue in September.







In other news, a Choir Room has been identified and completed with a piano and newly built choir rehearsal desks (from our local carpenter, Andy Bialecki), generously donated by Richard Dahling.

MISSION STATEMENT


As the Episcopal Parish of St. John's of Lattingtown, we are called to the Body of Christ in our time and place by sharing with others the Gospel of Christ and by giving expression to God's love in the world through our giving and caring. Therefore, we seek:

- * To offer our lives to God's service through regular worship,
- * To deepen our relationship with God and nurture our fellowship through openness to God's word as revealed in studying Holy Scripture,
- * To reach out to the needs of all people, and
- * To be faithful stewards of all we have received.

We believe that the beautiful church in which we worship is symbolic of the advantages we have inherited which must be used to further the work of Christ throughout the world.

A BRIEF HISTORY

elcome to our church! It was consecrated for use in 1916. A few years later the delicate woodwork designed by Scottish architect Sir John Lorimer was installed to create a warmth within that has enhanced our parish life ever since. The offices began as a residence, completed in 1919 and the Parish Hall, designed to recall the social life of medieval England, was added in 1927. The Sunday School building was constructed in 1954, and the church was expanded in 1957. The echo of prayer and music in traditional form continue to grace our worship.
