

forgive us all our offenses;


and grant that we may serve you

- 2 Lift up your hands in the holy place and bléss the Lord; * the Lord who made heaven and earth bless you / out of Zíon.








This hymn may be sung unaccompanied as a four-part canon at the distance of one measure.




