THE WELCOME

OPENING SENTENCE, p. 76

Officiant      Jesus said, "If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me." *Mark 8:34*

THE CONFESSION OF SIN, p. 79

Officiant      Let us confess our sins against God and our neighbor.

*People            Most merciful God,  
we confess that we have sinned against you  
by what we have done,  
and by what we have left undone.  
We have not loved you with our whole heart;  
we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves.  
We are truly sorry and humbly repent.  
For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ,  
have mercy on us and forgive us;  
that we may delight in your will,  
and walk in your ways,  
to the glory of your Name. Amen.*

Officiant      Almighty God have mercy on you, +forgive you all your sins through our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen you in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep you in eternal life. *Amen.*

**THE INVITATORY AND PSALTER, p. 80**

Officiant      Lord, open our lips.

**THE VENITE Psalm 95: 1-7, p. 82 (said by all in union)**

*Come, let us sing to the Lord;  
let us shout for joy to the Rock of our salvation.  
Let us come before his presence with thanksgiving \*  
and raise a loud shout to him with psalms.*

*For the Lord is a great God, \*  
and a great King above all gods.  
In his hand are the caverns of the earth, \*  
and the heights of the hills are his also.  
The sea is his, for he made it, \*  
And his hands have molded the dry land.*

- 6 O God, you know my foolishness, \*

let not those who seek you be disgraced because of me,  
O God of Israel.
- 8 Surely, for your sake have I suffered reproach, \*  
and shame has covered my face.
- 9 I have become a stranger to my own kindred, \*  
an alien to my mother's children.
- 10 Zeal for your house has eaten me up; \*  
the scorn of those who scorn you has fallen upon me.
- 11 I humbled myself with fasting, \*  
but that was turned to my reproach.
- 12 I put on sack-cloth also, \*  
and became a byword among them.
- 13 Those who sit at the gate murmur against me, \*  
and the drunkards make songs about me.
- 14 But as for me, this is my prayer to you, \*  
at the time you have set, O LORD:
- 15 "In your great mercy, O God, \*  
answer me with your unfailing help.

16 Save me from the mire; do not let me sink; \*  
let me be rescued from those who hate me  
and out of the deep waters.

17 Let not the torrent of waters wash over me,  
neither let the deep swallow me up; \*  
do not let the Pit shut its mouth upon me.

18 Answer me, O LORD, for your love is kind; \*  
in your great compassion, turn to me."

*Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit: \*  
as it was in the beginning is now, and will be for ever. Amen.*

#### THE FIRST LESSON

Reader            A reading from The First Letter of Paul to the Corinthians 12:12-26.

*J*ust as a body, though one, has many parts, but all its many parts form one body, so it is with Christ. For we were all baptized by one Spirit so as to form one body—whether Jews or Gentiles, slave or free—and we were all given the one Spirit to drink. Even so the body is not made up of one part but of many. Now if the foot should say, “Because I am not a hand, I do not belong to the body,” it would not for that reason stop being part of the body. And if the ear should say, “Because I am not an eye, I do not belong to the body,” it would not for that reason stop being part of the body. If the whole body were an eye, where would the sense of hearing be? If the whole body were an ear, where would the sense of smell be? But in fact God has placed the parts in the body, every one of them, just as he wanted them to be. If they were all one part, where would the body be? As it is, there are many parts, but one body. The eye cannot say to the hand, “I don’t need you!” And the head cannot say to the feet, “I don’t need you!” On the contrary, those parts of the body that seem to be weaker are indispensable, and the parts that we think are less honorable we treat with special honor. And the parts that are unpresentable are treated with special modesty, while our presentable parts need no special treatment. But God has put the body together, giving greater honor to the parts that lacked it, so that there should be no division in the body, but that its parts should have equal concern for each other. If one part suffers, every part suffers with it; if one part is honored, every part rejoices with it.

## THE SECOND LESSON

Reader            A reading from the Gospel of Mark 8:27-9:1.

*J*esus and his disciples went on to the villages around Caesarea Philippi. On the way he asked them, "Who do people say I am?" They replied, "Some say John the Baptist; others say Elijah; and still others, one of the prophets." "But what about you?" he asked. "Who do you say I am?" Peter answered, "You are the Messiah." Jesus warned them not to tell anyone about him. He then began to teach them that the Son of Man must suffer many things and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests and the teachers of the law, and that he must be killed and after three days rise again. He spoke plainly about this, and Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. But when Jesus turned and looked at his disciples, he rebuked Peter. "Get behind me, Satan!" he said. "You do not have in mind the concerns of God, but merely human concerns." Then he called the crowd to him along with his disciples and said: "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. For whoever wants to save their life will lose it, but whoever loses their life for me and for the gospel will save it. What good is it for someone to gain the whole world, yet forfeit their soul? Or what can anyone give in exchange for their soul? If anyone is ashamed of me and my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, the Son of Man will be ashamed of them when he comes in his Father's glory with the holy angels." And he said to them, "Truly I tell

you, some who are standing here will not taste death before they see that the kingdom of God has come with power.”

**CANTICLE 14:** A Song of Penitence, *Kyrie Pantokrator*, p. 90 (said by all in unison)

O Lord and Ruler of the hosts of heaven, \*  
  God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob,  
  and of all their righteous offspring:  
You made the heavens and the earth, \*  
  with all their vast array.  
All things quake with fear at your presence; \*  
  they tremble because of your power.  
But your merciful promise is beyond all measure; \*  
  it surpasses all that our minds can fathom.  
O Lord, you are full of compassion, \*  
  long-suffering, and abounding in mercy.  
You hold back your hand; \*  
  you do not punish as we deserve.  
In your great goodness, Lord,  
you have promised forgiveness to sinners, \*  
  that they may repent of their sin and be saved.  
And now, O Lord, I bend the knee of my heart, \*  
  and make my appeal, sure of your gracious goodness.  
I have sinned, O Lord, I have sinned, \*
