MINISTRY HIGHLIGHTS – St. John's of Lattingtown

Children and Families:

- ♦ Children's Christmas Pageant was held on Christmas Eve at 4:00 pm, a wonderful new addition to the St John's Christmas services!
- ♦ DUO (Do Unto Others) St John's own Youth Group began in October of 2022. This year they have been working closely with NOSH and presented two art exhibits at the Glen Cove Library featuring their project called "Doors", done in collaboration with the men from the homeless shelter, as well as many other community service projects.
- ♦ Religious Ed for Kids, our full year program, held every Tuesday at 3:45 pm! This year we had two classes—a Communion Class and Next Step in Faith Class.
- ♦ Confirmation Class 2025 – there will be twenty children confirmed here by the Bishop on May 18, 2025.



Outreach:

- ♦ Helping Hands Ministry– continues to recognize our parishioners with cards and notes to celebrate milestones.
- ♦ Opening Night Lights, held on June 17th, kicked off summer with a parents vs. kids in whiffle ball!
- ♦ Fall Ball– kids programming for ages 3– 6 years, held a series of events in Sept-Oct for the “littles”.
- ♦ Friends of St John's continued their Soap for Hope toiletry bags, and the Thanksgiving meal boxes for the underserved of our community.
- ♦ St John's participated again in the annual Adopt-A-Family program, helping provide Christmas presents for many in our community.
- ♦ The Outreach Grant Committee awarded grants to twelve deserving non profit community organizations. All funds were raised at our annual St John's Country Fair!

Music:

- ♦ Ruairaidh Sutherland, Director of Music Ministry, has expanded the St John's Choir, Choral Scholars program and organized many music offerings.
- ♦ Choral Evensong with Catherine Dienes-Williams, Handel's Messiah, Stanier's Crucifixion, Lenten Lessons & Carols in collaboration with Christ Church Manhasset, have been among the wonderful music events this year!
- ♦ Choir for Girls grades 3-12 on Tuesdays afternoons began in October 2024. They continue to sing with the parish choir one Sunday monthly as well as at Evensong.
- ♦ 2025 music schedule includes Evensong on several Sunday afternoons, a St John's choir concert on June 1, 2025, and another guest musician for Evensong in the summer of 2025.

Adult Formation:

- ♦ Faith Matters, our adult Bible Study, continues every Sunday at 9:30 am.
- ♦ The Lenten Wednesdays Program studied “Reimagining the Ignatian Examen” by Mark E. Thibodeaux, SJ. Stations of the Cross began the evening each week.
- ♦ Nurture (Prayer) Group– meets weekly on Mondays at 10:00 am

Wellness Ministry:

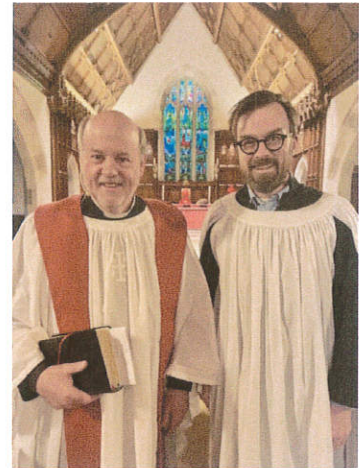
- ♦ AA – we have two weekly meetings (Tues and Sat) – Tuesday AA group just celebrated eight years at St John's!

Fundraising

- ♦ 71st Annual St John's Country Fair was outstanding! This year featured an obstacle course, the return of the famous and beloved St. John's Grill, as well as many new games and rides!
- ♦ Spring Dinner Dance 2024–was held here at St John's on May 4, 2024! This wonderful fundraiser was a fantastic evening for all, with proceeds beyond our expectations!
- ♦ Rector's Advisory Group continues to help develop long and short term fiscal strategies.



The Barn:

- ♦ In its fourth year, our “Thrift Shop” is a tremendous asset and a cherished Sunday experience, from April–December!
- ♦ Sales continue year round on Instagram and Facebook.

Buildings and Grounds:

- ♦ There were multiple renovations to the Education Building, including new flooring and painting.
- ♦ Slate roof repairs and partial roof replacement have been completed.
- ♦ Our Fire Alarm System has been upgraded.
- ♦ Emergency Lighting in school, offices, Parish Hall and church are completed.
- ♦ Gate House has addressed basement leaking, and new washer and dryer have been installed.
- ♦ Several 2025 projects are being prioritized by the Buildings and Grounds Committee including a new HVAC system, major repairs to the slate patio and paths, upgrading the bathrooms, etc.

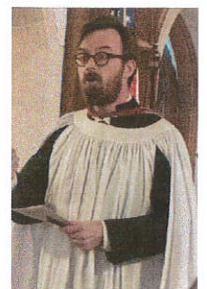

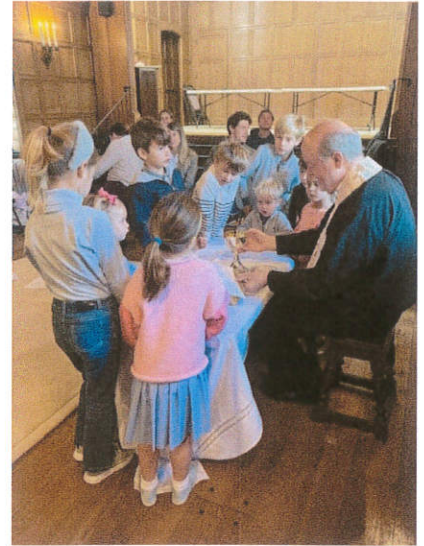

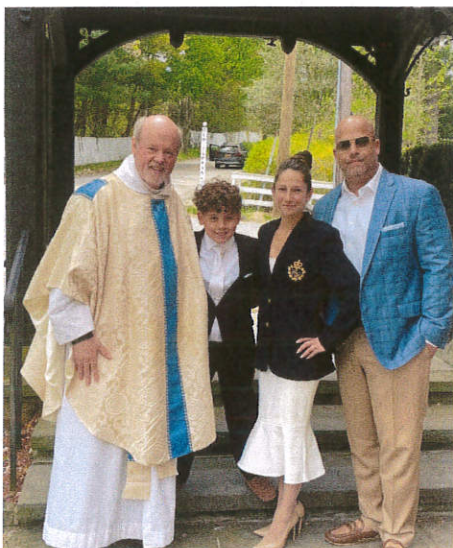

Attendance & Impact:
Lines 1 through 5 helps us measure the scope and reach of all churches while acknowledging that not every participant or person is impacted by the church as a member. In addition, our hope is that these questions also capture long distance (virtual) engagement. 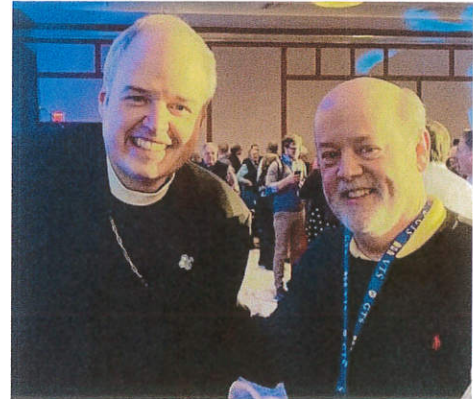

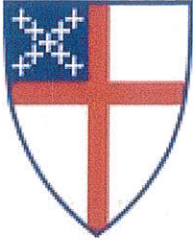

St. John's of Lattingtown Summary of Changes to Bylaws Presented May 4, 2025

Topic	Changes in Bylaws
Warden Nomination and Election	Nominated by the Vestry instead of the nominating committee, and elected by the Parish instead of the Vestry
Terms for Wardens	Term limits replaced by a general expectation that Wardens won't serve more than 2 consecutive 2-year terms (disregarding service of less than 1 year) but may serve longer
Size of Vestry	Vestry reduced from 10 to 9 (plus the Rector and 2 Wardens)
Terms for Vestry Members	Term limits replaced by a general expectation that Vestry members won't serve more than 2 consecutive 3-year terms (disregarding service of less than 18 months) but may serve longer
Election of Treasurer and Secretary/Clerk	Must be members of the Vestry (instead of prohibited from serving on the Vestry).
Terms for Treasurer and Secretary/Clerk	Term extended from 1 to 3 years, with a general expectation that Treasurer and Secretary/Clerk won't serve more than 2 consecutive terms (disregarding service of less than 18 months) but may serve longer
Deadline for Nominating Committee	4 weeks instead of 5 weeks before the Annual Meeting
Deadline for Notice of Annual Meeting	2 weeks instead of 4 weeks before the Annual Meeting
Conflict of Interest Procedures	Procedures for addressing potential conflicts of interest expanded to include Wardens, Treasurer and Secretary/Clerk, and Vestry authorized to grant waivers
